WE'VE GOT REACH

To Get Things Done. We fund hundreds of nonprofits and seed grassroots organizations that can work individually and together to respond to ongoing challenges and emerging issues. As the ultimate connector, we have the leverage and relationships to move quickly and effectively.

LEVERAGE.

When you give to UJA, you're supporting close to \$180 million in grants awarded annually to a network of nonprofit partners and hundreds of grantees in New York, in Israel, and around the world. And...

MILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN GOVERNMENT FUNDING

UJA advocates at the federal, state, and city level for millions of dollars in government funding, benefiting the social service sector, nonprofit security, Holocaust survivors, Jewish day schools, and more.

CAPITAL FUNDING

We raise millions of dollars in capital funding on behalf of our partners to buy, construct, and renovate facilities to meet our community's changing needs.

ECONOMIES OF SCALE

We provide our partners an array of cost-saving and consultancy services: Professional development. Technical support. Savings on insurance. Help with investment management.

SAVINGS ON OVERHEAD

We rent UJA-owned properties to our partners at a nominal cost, saving network nonprofits \$26 million annually — money they can spend on helping people.

That's how we strengthen our network of partners from the ground up. And that's how we're prepared to handle any crisis thrown our way.

REDUCING OUR NETWORK'S CARBON FOOTPRINT

Incentivizing energy audits for all 22 partners JCCs. **Investigating** what it could look like to turn partner facilities into "passive houses" (among the highest energy saving technologies). **Investing** in hydroponic gardens at agencies that run food pantries so they can grow produce. **Imparting** the tools Jewish teens need to be powerful climate change activists.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

THIS IS WHAT POVERTY LOOKS LIKE...

- › Standing at the grocery checkout and asking the cashier to subtract an item, then another — not knowing how you'll feed your family.
- › Taking your medications every other day — to save on a refill.
- › Missing a job interview — because you can't pay for child care.



50% OF WORKING-AGE NYC HOUSEHOLDS HAVE INCOMES THAT CAN'T MEET BASIC NEEDS.

OUR SHARED IMPACT:

First, food. We're funding the largest kosher food network in the country. We've transformed 15 of our food pantries to a digital model (serving 35 additional satellite locations) that prioritizes client choice and efficiency. Because nobody should feel embarrassed to get the help they need.

We're all about HUBS — one-stop social service centers that provide food, job training, benefits enrollment, mental health services, and financial and legal counseling, all of which put client dignity front and center. We have one in Queens that's been changing lives since 2020. We're opening another in Brooklyn in early 2024. And we've recently opened CUNY Hillel Hubs, where low-income students can access food, employment counseling, and mental health support (while also getting a taste of Jewish life).

What will never change? Making sure Holocaust survivors — particularly those in poverty — have the services and support to live their old age comfortably.





STANDING AGAINST ANTISEMITISM AND ANTI-ZIONISM

THIS IS WHAT WHAT ANTISEMITISM TODAY LOOKS LIKE...

- › Verbal or physical attacks on the street because you're wearing a yarmulke.
- › Death threats on social media or harassment on campus because you're identified as Jewish or pro-Israel.
- › Swastikas or other hate symbols graffitied on Jewish spaces.


OUR SHARED IMPACT:

First, safety. Our Community Security Initiative monitors threats online and off, helping 2,400 local Jewish institutions stay secure. We also advocate for government security funding at all levels.

At the same time, we're building bridges, working with other ethnic communities on joint programming and leadership development.

We're changing hearts and minds through education and Israel experience trips, which give people of all backgrounds — including leaders from government, academia, and social justice circles — the tools to tell Israel's complex story, recognizing that while we must hold a safe space for criticism, delegitimizing or denying the right for Israel to exist crosses the line.

What's new? We're partnering with ADL to train Jewish teens in New York to address antisemitism and anti-Zionism on campus.



CONFRONTING A MENTAL HEALTH EPIDEMIC

THESE ARE WHAT MENTAL HEALTH STRUGGLES LOOK LIKE...

- › Feeling isolated and scarily alone as a senior citizen.
- › Dealing with crippling anxiety as a teen — and being the parent or teacher without the resources to help.
- › Barely coping as a traumatized refugee in a new country.

OUR SHARED IMPACT:

First, community-wide care. We've long supported leading agencies providing critical mental health services to people of all ages, including Jews from different communities and New Yorkers of all backgrounds — and more recently, Ukrainian refugees dealing with the trauma of war.

We're ahead of the curve in responding to what has been called the "loneliness epidemic," forging connections for people at life stages that can be particularly isolating — with programs for new parents, recently retired men, and frail and homebound older adults. To reach teens, we created and support HereNow, where teens gather to lead the conversation on mental health and resilience (online and off).

What's new? A whole network of support, including counseling, legal services, and access to housing for domestic violence survivors. Also, a helpline to support teachers so they're better equipped to support kids.




STRENGTHENING A JEWISH AND DEMOCRATIC ISRAEL

OUR SHARED IMPACT:

First, meeting basic needs. We're supporting a broad range of overseas agencies and grassroots nonprofits, offering care for the most vulnerable, including the elderly, Holocaust survivors, and children in need.

Then, economic opportunity for people who are often marginalized — Haredi, Ethiopians, and Arab-Israelis — so they, too, can find success, especially in Israel's world-famous tech sector.

We're modeling what collaboration looks like, even in the most fraught times, bringing leaders who represent the various sectors of Israeli society together to work on issues that transcend difference and benefit many communities.

What's new? Convening Israel's most prominent philanthropies to discuss potential joint funding initiatives to counter the impact of potential new governmental policies and legislation.



NURTURING JEWISH CONNECTIONS

THIS IS WHAT WE CONSIDER WHEN WE THINK ABOUT JEWISH LIFE...

- How can we continue to make Jewish life meaningful and relevant in a fast-changing world?
- In polarizing times, how do we connect Jews of different backgrounds?
- How do we meet people in the places they are? In ways that speak to them?

OUR SHARED IMPACT:

First, Jewish spaces and places. We proudly fund Jewish community centers. Hillels. Jewish day schools. Jewish summer camps (including our 500+ acre Henry Kaufmann Campgrounds) — all the places where Jewish life comes alive.

Then, we look deeper. We’re investing in nonprofits that are filling in gaps, targeting the full diversity of our community, including those who identify as Jews of Color, LGBTQ+, Russian speaking, and interfaith, with Jewish programming that speaks to their experiences. And we’re exploring how we can offer belonging and meaning to a rapidly aging Jewish population.

What’s new? As new (and dare we say... hip?) Jewish neighborhoods pop up around New York, we’re there, supporting local Jewish organizations that are offering creative avenues to Jewish life — in Astoria, Long Island City, Little Neck, and North Brooklyn.

What will never change? We’re the ultimate convener, offering a big tent where all voices are welcome, creating opportunities for Jews of all stripes to find common ground.
